From the Constitution of Bethesda Lutheran Church, 2024

C13.05. When a vacancy occurs in a position for which this congregation calls a minister, a *Call Committee* of six (6) voting members shall be elected by the congregation council. Term of office will terminate upon installation of the newly called minister.

C13.05.01. Call Committee shall:

- **a.** Elect a chairperson who will be the primary contact with the Synod office, congregation council and the congregation.
- b. Represent a cross-section of the congregation (by age, gender, etc.)
- **C.** Seek to determine the needs of the congregation before the selection process begins.
- d. Interview perspective candidate(s) and make a recommendation of a pastor for congregation's consideration.
- e. The chair of the call committee shall notify prospective candidate of congregation's decision.
- f. Keep synod, congregation council, and congregation informed of progress.

The Lord's Cupboard

As of this writing, the Lord's Cupboard is not doing well with matching the funds (\$2,500) for the "Love the Lord, Love the Lord's Cupboard" challenge, deadline is December 1. This is what we usually use for the Thanksgiving and Christmas Vouchers for families at the Lord's Cupboard. Because of that and some issues with the grocery store vouchers we have decided to make a change in the store vouchers and the Christmas Vouchers. In December, we will combine the two vouchers for a total of \$75.

In January of 2025, grocery store vouchers will no longer contain a list of items people can or have to buy. They will be written for \$45. Currently grocery store vouchers are costing us anywhere from \$30 to \$55 per family. Setting a definite amount will allow us to budget better. Everyone will get the same amount to buy things they need from the grocery store. We will ask that they not buy alcoholic beverages, soda/pop, or junk food except potato chips, corn chips, tortilla chips, and pork rinds.

We don't want you to think the Lord's Cupboard is destitute, we are not. But our money is dwindling a little faster because we have more people using the Lord's Cupboard and the cost of food has doubled in the last 10 years.

We are hopeful of having a fundraiser or two in the coming year. We also will be looking for grant money to help supplement the increased usage. These are the changes happening at the Lord's Cupboard we thought you might be interested in.







What you need:

- Large wooden craft stick
- Small green wooden craft sticks
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Bible
- Permanent marker
- Craft glue
- Optional: star stickers or craft jewels

What you do:

- 1. Place the large stick on a table vertically, like a tree trunk.

DO YOU KNOW?

From the Constitution and Bylaws of Bethesda Lutheran Church, these are responsibilities of the <u>Board of Education</u>. As space allows, future Bethesda News will highlight other Boards.

C14.01.04. The **Board of Education** shall consist of a minimum of four (4) voting members elected at an annual meeting for a term of two (2) years. No member shall be eligible for more than two (2) consecutive terms. The Board of Education shall:

- a. Develop an effective teaching ministry which includes the training of teachers and leaders, and provide opportunity for study by every member of the congregation through its teaching agencies.
- b. Report its activities to the annual meeting of the congregation and at such other times as the congregation may decide.
- c. Plan and coordinate events and activities that will enhance the spiritual growth of the preschool through 6th grade children, including securing Sunday School teachers, researching curriculum, and being willing to teach when the need arises.
- d. Encourage preschoolers through sixth graders to share their talents during worship services.
- e. Plan fundraising events for mission trips and other activities.
- f. Facilitate in finding parents and other adults to drive, chaperone, provide food, etc. for youth group activities.
- g. Communicate to parents and the congregation what is happening with the children and their growth in Christ.
