Faith Finds a Way

I surmise that many of us have seen the original Jurassic Park film from 1993. Even if one hasn't seen it, we are familiar with the premise, especially because Jurassic Park has spawned numerous books, films, tv shows, video games, amusement park rides, themed vehicles and countless toys. In the original film, Dr. Ian Malcolm portrayed by Jeff Goldblum delivers arguably the most memorable quote of the entire franchise, "Life will not be contained. Life breaks free. It expands to new territories. It crashes through barriers painfully, even dangerously. But well uh, there it is...I'm simply saying that life, uh, finds a way."

That was something I noticed recently when I was on a family walk. I came upon a driveway that invited contemplation. Because growing in the cracks of the cement driveway were multiple flowers. Evidently, the owner of the property decided to let the flowers continue to grow, as they were all about 18 inches tall. I looked at Lisa and I said, "Life finds a way." Of course she smiled and said, "Jurassic Park."

Yet, I have still been drawn back to that very brief moment in my own contemplation. It reminds me so much about how faith works in our lives. Sometimes we know for certain that moment in our life where faith became clear. Your grandma was chatting with you at the table about the time such and such thing happened and the only possible explanation grandma could ascertain was God showering her with grace so that she might have the faith to trust the outcome for better or for worse. Other times, we are unable to see the moment as clearly. It's those times, that I believe the growing flower in the crack emulates how in the midst of such and such season, God continues to shower us with unmerited grace, watering us little by little, so that in the most challenging of growing conditions, located in an area not even suitable for growth, our tiny seed may spring out of the ground to eventually become a full-fledged flower of faith.

Once this happens, we feel the warmth of the sun with a new purpose. We respond in a way that points others towards the giver of that growth, our Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Thus, the direction of our life changes and we begin to view the world through the very same unmerited grace we received from God, that in the power of the Holy Spirit, gave us faith to believe that Jesus Christ has indeed died and rose for me and for you.

Now, in this time and place, in the midst of the beginning of my time as your Interim Pastor, the beginning of a new academic year, the beginning of subtle changes to our church community, God is trying to shower us with unmerited grace so that we may come to believe that faith finds a way. Whether that faith is nurtured through public worship, in Bible and Brew, through Confirmation, by Wednesday Kids, during Tuesday Time Together, volunteering with the Lord's Cupboard, through High School Youth Group, by participating in worship as a reader, greeter, Communion Minister, singer, acolyte, accompanist, sound or PowerPoint tech, serving on a standing Board or on Church Council. There are so many ways that faith can be nourished in this Body of Christ who gathers at Bethesda Lutheran in Jewell, Iowa. Thus, my dear siblings in Christ, may you see how the Holy Spirit moves faith to find a way in your life, this very day?




Create adorable sheep using graham crackers, marshmallows, and a little imagination!

What comes to mind when you hear the words "human trafficking"?


Is it a crime that happens only in distant countries or large cities? Something that could never touch rural lowa communities?

Stacy Besch, a volunteer with Team lowa, will present the 55-minute documentary *Gridshock*—a powerful film produced by a survivor of sexual violence. *Gridshock* exposes the demand driving human trafficking in lowa and features voices from survivors, law enforcement, advocates, policymakers, and even a recovering sex addict.

After the screening, Stacy will share eye-opening facts about how this crime is affecting people right here in our communities. Her presentation will both raise awareness and provide education on what we can do.
