Harvest Faith Beloved siblings in Christ of Bethesda,

Autumn arrives with a rhythm we can set our watches by: the crisp morning air, the smell of turned earth and livestock once masked by the golden waves of corn and soybeans no longer growing in their fields. As a people in a rural community, this season often reminds us how God cares for the whole of creation and that the work of hands and hearts together brings life. As your pastor, I see the harvest not only in our fields but in the ways God is gathering and renewing people through the good news of Jesus Christ proclaimed, prayed, and proselytized through you.

The harvest in the fields teaches us about dependence and gratitude. Farmers plant with hope, tend with patience, and trust God's provision through sun, rain, hail and wind. We, too, are called to patient labor in faith—planting seeds of love, watering with prayerful presence, and trusting that Jesus, the true sower, multiplies what we place in his hands. Jesus himself reminds us in Matthew 9:37 - 38 that the harvest is plentiful even when the workers are few, and he sends us out with prayer and purpose to gather it in.

Our congregation's life together is part of that holy harvest. When we gather for worship, serve a neighbor, or listen to someone's story, we participate in the gathering work of Christ. This work is sustained by faithful stewardship. Tithing is not merely a way to form the budget. It is a spiritual discipline that shapes our identity as God's people. Giving is an act of worship that acknowledges God as Lord of all and entrusts our resources so the gospel can be proclaimed, mercy offered, hope given and the Sacraments administered. As St. Paul teaches in 2 Corinthians 9:6 - 7, the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly. Instead, St. Paul wants us to know that God loves a cheerful giver whose generosity multiplies for the blessing of Many.

Because of your faithful gifts, we feed families through outreach programs like the Lord's Cupboard, support the children and youth learning to follow Jesus such as the technological and room updates in recent years, and maintain a place where worship and reconciliation can take root. Your tithes and offerings make it possible for Bethesda to be a visible sign of Christ's love in Jewell and beyond. Every dollar given is a seed tending toward a harvest of transformed lives.

This harvest season I invite you to reflect on how your giving participates in God's story. Consider increasing your regular gift, offering a special harvest gift, or committing to a tithe if you have not yet done so. Doing so allows us to plan boldly, serve generously, and proclaim Jesus with clear, joyful witness.

May the rhythm of the fields remind us that God's work requires our hands and our hearts. May the harvest awaken gratitude and compel generous living. And may Jesus, who gave himself for our salvation, continue to gather us into abundant life.

Dear Bethesda Members,

At our council meeting this week (September 8, 2025), we learned the Chapel air conditioner has stopped working. Neighbors Heating and Cooling gave us two options: replace the coil for \$2,500 or replace the entire unit for \$8,600. The Trustees voted unanimously to recommend replacing the unit, believing it to be the better long-term choice financially.

Because of the cost involved, a congregational meeting will be held to review and discuss this decision. Announcements will also be made during worship on September 28 and October 5, and the agenda will be included in the October newsletter.

This isn't just about an air conditioner, it's about how we, as a congregation, choose to care for what God has trusted us with. As your council, we look forward to discussing this with you and deciding together what is best for our church moving forward.





Create a simple and meaningful prayer box your family can use to share requests and pray together all week long.


What you need:

THE SURPASSING GRACE


The word "surpass" means to exceed, to go beyond, to transcend the reach or capacity of. In his second letter to the church at Corinth, St. Paul refers to "the surpassing grace of God that he has given you" (2 Corinthians 9:14, NRSV). Paul was reminding the Corinthians of the amazing, abundant grace God had showered upon them.

When Paul wrote that letter, the church in Jerusalem was suffering intense persecution. The members were poor and struggling to be faithful under dire circumstances.

Paul knew the church at Corinth was doing fine financially and that they had a mind to help out the Jerusalem church. He wrote: "You glorify God ... by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, while they ... pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you" (2 Corinthians 9:13-14, NRSV).

NOVEMBER Adult Ed. Series:

The ELCA's "Use of the Means of Grace"

During the month of November, there are 5 Sundays. Interim Pastor Jonathan Dolan is inviting you to join a four-session (5-week) Adult Education series at the same time that Bible and Brew meets beginning on Nov. 2. Because there are 5 Sundays, that allows us an opportunity to spend a bit more time specifically in Parts 2 and 3 which are the sessions on Baptism and Holy Communion. This faith opportunity seeks to bring Word, Baptism, and Communion to life—rooted in the ELCA's governing document on those practices shaped for folks who value practical, faithful living in everyday work and community.

In each session we will read through the assigned parts together which means you DO NOT need to read anything beforehand, but you may choose to do so to familiarize yourself with the content for the session. By the end of month, you will be able to answer the question of why Lutherans are a Christian denomination that is rooted in the historic liturgy and sustained through the Sacraments to empower us for mission in the world.

Who would benefit from this class? This class is ideal for high schoolers recently Confirmed, lifelong Lutherans, folks who became Lutheran for their spouse, folks who have longed for a refresher of the central things of faith and everyone else in between.

<u>The first session</u> will cover the Preface and Part 1. The **Preface** grounds the series in a clear, life-giving claim: Jesus Christ is the living Word and the Spirit works through Word and Sacrament to create and sustain the Church to the glory of the Father. **Part 1: Proclamation of the Word and the Christian Assembly** will explore worship as the community's primary work of hearing Scripture, singing, confessing, and preaching. Practical, down-to-earth examples will show how the assembly gathers people to be shaped for service, care, and daily faithfulness—ideas you can take straight into family life, classrooms, clinics, and fields.

<u>The second session</u> will cover **Part 2: Holy Baptism and the Christian Assembly** which celebrates Baptism as God's once-for-all gift that marks us as God's own. We'll cover baptism for all ages, the role of sponsors and families, and simple ways to live out baptismal promises in routines, caregiving, teaching moments, and community life.

<u>The third session</u> Part 3: Holy Communion and the Christian Assembly invites us to re-discover the table where Christ meets us with forgiveness, grace and mercy in his very Body and Blood in the form of bread and wine. Topics include the unity formed at the table, why regular celebration matters, practical hospitality for those at home or in care, and how Communion shapes how we welcome and serve one another.

<u>The fourth session</u> Part 4: The Means of Grace and Christian Mission will tie Word and Sacrament to mission—how worship and sacraments equip the baptized to serve their neighbors, teach with compassion, and respond faithfully to daily challenges. Expect concrete, practical next steps for living sacramental faith in your daily routines and community commitments.

Finally, you might be saying to yourself, "Pastor why is this an entire page?" Because it is a 63-page document and he did his best summarizing it as briefly as he could. Pastor Jonathan hopes you will come on this faith journey. Further, he hopes so many folks will attend that we will need to move out of the Lounge and into Fellowship Hall!
